# **Student/Parent Actions**

- 1. Before the video, check for prior knowledge and ask your child what they know about active listening.
- 2. Play Essential African Threads.
- 3. Ask your child to share which of the four stories was their favorite and why.

### Assessment (options)

- Exit Ticket: What did the lion do wrong from the very beginning of the story?
- Exit Ticket: Should the frog be worried that he is not bigger than the rest of the frogs? Why?
- Exit Ticket: What are the gold words? (yes ma'am, no ma'am, yes sir, no sir, I love you)
